Keynote Speaker for the 2024 Annual Careers Event – Professor Dan Woodman

Theme: Building your arsenal for many job opportunities in the future.

Professor Woodman is the TR Ashworth Professor in Sociology at the University of Melbourne and co-Chief Investigator on the Life Patterns project, one of the largest and longest running studies of young lives, tracking three generations of young Australians from the end of secondary school into adulthood. He is also co-Editor-in-Chief of the Journal of Youth Studies and has written widely on young people's lives and the sociology of generations.
