Melbourne High School recognises the importance of the partnership between our school and parents and carers to support student learning, engagement and wellbeing. We share a commitment to, and a responsibility for, creating and maintaining an inclusive and safe school environment for our students.

The programs and teaching at Melbourne High School support and promote the principles and practice of Australian democracy, including a commitment to:

- elected government
- the rule of law
- equal rights for all before the law
- freedom of religion
- freedom of speech and association
- the values of openness and tolerance.

To celebrate and embed our Statement of Values and Philosophy in the minds and actions of our school community, we

- display posters and banners promoting our values
- recognise, in our school newsletter, events and individuals reflecting our values
- provide awards and recognition for students actively demonstrating our values
- discuss our values with students in the classroom, meetings and assemblies.

Melbourne High School is committed to an involved and diverse school community by:

- Providing students, parents and staff with a sense of belonging to a community with clear goals as articulated in our strategic plan.
- Encouraging and expecting the involvement of all members of the school community
- Fostering empathy, intercultural understanding, respect, cooperation and harmony
- Supporting social responsibility in a local, national and international context.

BEHAVIOURAL EXPECTATIONS

Melbourne High School acknowledges that the behaviour of staff, parents, carers and students has an impact on our school community and culture.

Staff have a range of expectations around behaviour and must follow our school and Department policies including Respectful Behaviours within the School Community Policy and the Victorian Public Service Code of Conduct and Values. Teaching staff also adhere to the Victorian Teaching Profession Code of Conduct.

Students are supported by school staff to meet expected standards of behaviour as outlined in our Student Wellbeing and Engagement Policy, Inclusion and Diversity Policy, Bullying Prevention Policy.

Information about the expectations on parents and carers to ensure schools remain respectful and inclusive places is outlined in the Department's <u>Respectful Behaviours within the School Community Policy</u> and our <u>Respect for School Staff Policy</u>.

UNREASONABLE BEHAVIOURS

Schools are not public places, and the Principal has the right to permit or deny entry to school grounds (for more information, see our Visitors Policy).

Unreasonable behaviour that is demonstrated by school staff, parents, carers, students or members of our school community will not be tolerated at school, or during school activities.

Unreasonable behaviour includes:

- being violent or threatening violence of any kind, including physically intimidating behaviour such as aggressive hand gestures or invading another person's personal space
- Harassment, bullying and unlawful discrimination
- speaking or behaving in a rude, aggressive or threatening way, either in person, via email, social media, or over the telephone
- sending demanding, rude, confronting or threatening letters, emails or text messages
- discriminatory or derogatory comments
- the use of social media or public forums to make inappropriate or threatening remarks about the school, staff or students.

Unreasonable behaviour and/or failure to uphold the principles of this <u>Statement of Values and School</u> <u>Philosophy</u> may lead to further investigation and sanctions.

At the Principal's discretion, unreasonable behaviour may be managed by:

- requesting that the parties attend a mediation or counselling sessions
- implementing specific communication protocols
- written warnings
- conditions of entry to school grounds or school activities
- exclusion from school grounds or attendance at school activities
- reports to Victoria Police or appropriate law enforcement agency
- legal action.

Inappropriate student behaviour will be managed in according with our school's <u>Student Wellbeing</u> and Engagement Policy and Bullying Prevention Policy.
